The topic scheduled for May 22nd is Evolutionary Origins of Homosexuality presented by Paul McNamara: In an essay published in the Gay and Lesbian Review, the three authors present scientific evidence that male same-sex sexual preference is largely determined prenatally via inherited genes, modified in utero. They also posit that male homosexuality appears to have arisen because of its potentially benefits for the survive-ability of the family. A link to this essay will be provided before the meeting. The discussion will focus on understanding the biology of sexual orientation, which is still in a nascent stage.




Please Note: There is a reason for **SAGE** to have a reservation cutoff date and time for each event. Therefore, no reservations will be accepted after such time.

SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP



Tin Man: A Novel, by Sarah Winman: Ellis Judd doesn't know he has a heart. He's been too busy protecting it, as Winman *(When God Was a Rabbit)* reveals in this achingly beautiful novel about love and friendship. The story unfolds in luminous prose as Ellis, five years a widower in 1996 Oxford, his grief

still palpable, looks back on his life, reveling in his mother's love of art, which she shared with him and his closest friend, Michael. Ellis sacrificed his artistic ambitions when his abusive father made him follow in his footsteps to work at a car plant. His life implodes when his mother dies, and he finds comfort in his relationship with Michael, which evolves into something much deeper—but then Ellis falls in love and marries a free spirit named Annie. The three adults become an inseparable trio until Michael suddenly leaves Oxford for London. The tale's second half is told in a different but equally powerful voice through Michael's diary, which gives insight into his childhood up through the year he spends away, as well as the reason he returns to his two companions. In sharp portrayals of the three adults, the author shows how, despite all their challenges, they are able to love and support each other. Without sentimentality or melodrama, Winman stirringly depicts how people either interfere with or allow themselves and others to follow their hearts.

On Guard

No, this month's health column is not about fencing. I am going to continue discussing the subject of prescription medications and some common problems. I spoke of the app Good RX last month and they have excellent medication information on their site. NO, I do not have stock in this company, but I have found their online medication site easy to read without a medical degree.



10 Medications That Are Dangerous to Stop Abruptly

Some medications can be dangerous to stop abruptly. Not only could your medical condition get worse, but you could also have dangerous side effects. Remember to always consult with your Health Care Practitioner BEFORE stopping any medication.

1. Clonidine (Catapres & Catapres-TTS).

Treats high blood pressure. Stopping clonidine abruptly can cause a surge of stress hormones which can cause very high blood pressure.

2. Propranolol (Inderal) & other high blood pressure medications.

Treats many heart diseases, including high blood pressure, chest pain and atrial fibrillation. Stopping these medications can cause withdrawal symptoms such as higher blood pressure, chest pain, anxiety, fast heartbeat, and heart attack.

3. Venlafaxine (Effexor, Effexor XR).

Treats depression, anxiety, and panic disorder. This medication has a short half-life (leaves your body quickly). Stopping can shock your body with withdrawal symptoms of irritability, nausea, vomiting, dizziness, nightmares, headaches, and skin tingling.

4. Paroxetine (Paxil).

Treats depression, anxiety, obsessive-compulsive disorder, panic disorder, PTSD, Premenstrual disorder (PMDD), and social anxiety disorder. Also has a short half-life and can cause the same withdrawal symptoms as Venlafaxine (Number 3, above) plus flu-like symptoms, confusion, insomnia, and excessive dreams.

5. Benzodiazepines (Xanax, Ativan, Valium).

Treats anxiety, insomnia, and alcohol use disorder. The major withdrawal symptoms are seizures. Also, you may have headaches, heart palpitations, sweating, nausea, diarrhea, trouble sleeping, nightmares, irritability, agitation, memory and concentration problems, anxiety, panic attacks, tremors, muscle aches, pain and stiffness, confusion, delirium, delusions, and hallucinations.

6. Topiramate (Topamax).

Treats epilepsy and if stopped abruptly seizures worsen. It must be tapered down.

7. Gabapentin (Neurontin).

Treats seizures and nerve pain. Withdrawal can start as soon as 12 hours after stopping. Symptoms can occur for those taking high dosages. Low dose is defined as less than 900 mg, moderate dose as 900–1799 mg, and high dose as more than 1800 mg. Symptoms may include trouble sleeping, agitation, anxiety, restlessness, tiredness, sensitivity to light, headaches, sweating, dizziness, nausea, irritability, **irregular heartbeat**, and pain.

8. Prednisone (Sterapred, Deltasone) and other corticosteroids (cortisone, Prednisolone, methylprednisolone, dexamethasone, betamethasone, and hydrocortisone).

Treats allergies, skin conditions, Rheumatoid arthritis, some cancers, and kidney conditions. This medication must be tapered down. If not, symptoms are nausea, headaches, dizziness, vertigo, flu-like symptoms, anxiety, confusion, irritability, and sleep disturbances.

9. Codeine, morphine ER {MS Contin}, oxycodone (Roxicodone).

Opioid pain management. Withdrawal symptoms are sweating, diarrhea, generalized pain, restlessness, and anxiety.

10. Baclofen (Lioresal).

Treats muscle spasms. Withdrawal symptoms are fever, weakness, nausea, and worsening of muscle spasms. Injectable forms withdrawal symptoms can also include hallucinations, delirium, and seizures.

Minute for minute, you won't find a more romantic gay film this year than the British rugby drama IN FROM THE SIDE, a surprisingly moving sportsteam story slathered in sweat, streaked with mud, and dripping with sensuality. As a "B Squad" of gay athletes tries to overcome inexperience and push past rivalries to score an elusive win, a secret affair simmers among them. Mark (puppyeyed Alexander Lincoln) finds himself unable to avoid the blazing appeal of teammate Warren (Alexander King), with his cocky attitude and emotional unavailability. Following a drunken encounter, the two equally attached men from a cash-strapped and divided gay rugby club glide into an adulterous affair, but must conceal their growing feelings or risk destroying the rugby club they both love.

From the homoerotic matches to the team member rivalries to the sizzling love scenes, this British rugby movie is packed with big drama, sparky comedy, and powerfully emotional romance. The handsome leads feel like they've stepped straight from a Ralph Lauren sportswear spread, while its throbbingly atmospheric soundtrack is glorious, presenting the sport proudly as both captivating and brave.
