#### THE STORY OF THE SAGE-PRIME GENTLEMEN ROUND TABLE

In the fall of 2016, fellow SAGE and Prime Timers members John Siegfried and Deric Bownds posed a question to themselves: "Could it be possible for a group of gay men to exchange ideas without the conversation devolving into a discussion on penis size?" This inquiry eventually led to the formation of the Prime Gentlemen/SAGE Round Table group.

A proposal was put forth to establish a semimonthly contemporary topics or ideas group, with discussions spanning a wide range of areas such as science, politics, education, psychology, and technology. It was decided that each session would have a discussion leader who would provide a brief introduction to the chosen topic and to also act as a facilitator to guide the conversation. The idea of inviting outside speakers was also suggested. The proposal was submitted to the (then) Prime Timers and SAGE Boards, seeking their sponsorship. Upon receiving approval from the Boards, members from both groups were recruited. Within a short period, nearly two dozen individuals had agreed to participate. The inaugural meeting took place at the Pride Center on December 5, 2016.

The group experienced immediate success, with a small core of members providing collective leadership and delivering most of the presentations. Presenters from outside the group added to this mix. Over time, presentations based on personal experiences were included, which further contributed to the popularity of the group in the spring of 2020, with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the group could no longer convene in person so it transitioned to online meetings using the Zoom platform. The online format offered the added advantage of enabling participants and presenters from around the world to join. In April 2022, as pandemic restrictions eased, the group introduced Zoom hybrid meetings, allowing members to gather either in person at the Pride Center or join via Zoom. Current meetings are held using this format.





**Save The Date: Tuesday, July 18th**, for the first time, a Meet-Up at the fabulous **Black Rock** on North Federal Highway.



#### **SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP**



Jon Ransom's debut novel, *The Whale Tattoo*, is a gritty and haunting story that takes readers on a journey through the complicated life of Joe Gunner. Set in a small fishing village, the story begins when a sperm whale washes up on the local beach and whispers unsettling predictions into Joe's ear. He returns to his hometown, where he confronts his past and the consequences of his actions.

Through Joe's eyes, readers witness a world of anger and frustration, as he struggles with his own sexuality, his troubled relationship with his father, and the complicated dynamics between his ex-lover Tim Fysh, Tim's pregnant wife Dora, and Tim's violent brother Doug. Meanwhile, the whale continues to haunt him, a constant reminder of his past and his uncertain future.

Ransom's prose is both blunt and poetic, seamlessly blending events and memories to create an atmosphere of uncertainty and unease. Joe's emotions get the best of him, and he frequently gets lost in the past when the present becomes overwhelming. But despite his flaws and impulsive behavior, there is a core of nobility in him that makes him a sympathetic and relatable protagonist.

One of the great strengths of *The Whale Tattoo* is Ransom's pacing, which skillfully balances the forward momentum of the story with the slow, methodical exploration of Joe's character. The result is a gripping and emotionally coherent read that places readers firmly inside Joe's mind and the turmoil therein.

Despite its dark subject matter, The Whale Tattoo is not a book of "misery porn." Instead, Ransom offers a powerful exploration of the potential for growth and self-acceptance in the face of adversity. It's a tough act, but one that he pulls off with skill and sensitivity.

#### **Phantom**

No, this month's column is not about the closing of that Broadway Show after 35 years. We all heard about the phenomenon, that when someone loses a limb, they still have pain in the missing limb. The same occurs when we lose someone close, such as a spouse with whom we shared a long-term relationship. When my husband died, I thought I saw him walking out of the bedroom many times. Sometimes I would hear a voice, sense a smell, a warmth, or a feeling. Sensing their strong presence is a common occurrence and the medical professionals call this grief hallucinations. It is a common feature of the bereavement process. I was terrified that his presence would wane over time. Unfortunately, it did and a new problem occurred: loneliness. Almost 30% of seniors live alone. Loneliness is the sensation or feeling of being alone, regardless of the amount of social contact.



Many losses occur as we age. Friends and relatives are irreplaceable because the relationships have been nurtured over time and have become a part of us. Events can cause loneliness: retirement, change of living environment, physical decline (which may affect our mobility), hearing loss, lack of transportation, fear of being a burden on family and friends, and financial difficulties.

Research has linked social isolation/loneliness to a variety of physical and mental conditions such as: alcoholism, high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity, weakened immune system, anxiety, depression, cognitive decline, Alzheimer's disease, and even death.

#### Change

I often heard warmings that Florida lacks opportunities to make local friends. My husband was in a 12-step program and our local Florida friends came from those in the program. When he died, so did those friendships. I found SAGE and made acquaintances but very few friends with whom I share my life events. Social networks have kept some of my old Chicago friends still active. I can still keep trying and work on more acquaintances.





SAGE is a wonderful organization to meet friends but you cannot rely on just our outings. You have to get more involved in the community and meet others. Become involved in the community and meet more people. I have chosen volunteering: I loved the theater and I always wanted to know more about the creative process and operations of the theater. I can't act, sing, or dance but I can schlep. I volunteered at two theaters and it was a great learning experience. I met some great people who shared my interests.

What used to pique your interest so that you wanted to know more? Check out volunteer opportunities with your chamber of commerce (online) in your interested field. Take an adult learning course at a local college, if you are homebound see if they have online courses. Locate senior services that assist home-

bound seniors with a daily phone call or email. Expand your computer knowledge by learning new programs. If you like children there are many organizations that need volunteers, mentors, or just a friend to talk to children. Libraries offer programs for adults to read to children. Look, look, look for opportunities online.

Don't let that Phantom loneliness chandelier come crashing down.

Keep yourself active and it will dissipate the loneliness.


