SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

In **James Hannaham's** superb third novel – ***Didn't Nobody Give a Shit What Happened to Carlotta***, a trans woman returns home after spending half her life in a men's prison. She has a lot to say.



The title character of the novel is a Black Colombian woman who's just been paroled after spending nearly 22 years in prison. She was an accomplice in her cousin's robbery of a Brooklyn liquor store that led to a shopkeeper's murder; she transitioned during her incarceration, leading to routine abuses by inmates and correctional officers, including serial rape in solitary confinement. Upon her release, though, her demeanor is undefeated and stubbornly irrepressible: Hannaham often starts paragraphs with omniscient third-person descriptions followed by abrupt, unpunctuated interruptions by Carlotta. ("Carlotta turned on her heel and rushed back to the subway Yo this shit's too much a too much!") It's an effective rhetorical technique, showing her urge to take control of the narrative while counteracting the kinds of "official" narratives that get the story wrong about women like her. It also simply makes Carlotta's story engrossing reading. Carlotta's travels through Fort Greene, Brooklyn, during the day or so the novel tracks are only moderately eventful— finding her parole officer, applying for a job, visiting family, attempting to drive a car, attending a wake—but all of it is enlivened with her commentary. Much of her sass is a survival instinct—eventually, we learn just how traumatized she is, and she's enduring what proves to be a difficult reentry into society. In parts, the book reads like a time-travel story, as Carlotta observes changes in technology, manners, and her old stomping grounds. And in its day-in-the-life framing, hyperlocal, and rhetorical invention, it's also an homage to Ulysses, whose ending is flagrantly echoed here. Carlotta deserves a lot of things society rarely provides to women like her—among them, a role in great fiction. Hannaham gives Carlotta her due.

RSV & P+

It is fall and it is time to RSVP our vaccinations. This year besides flu we have RSV and a new Covid booster. I highly recommend getting all three. Our immune system is not as it was in our youth and we need all the help we can get. My fellow nursing students and I all got RSV when I was in nursing school when we did our clinical pediatric rotation at Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago. We survived because we were young (OK, I was in my early 40's but survived). You are familiar with the flu and Covid vaccinations but what is this RSV?

RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) is a virus that infects the lungs and respiratory tract causing cold-like symptoms. Most children get infected by age two but adults can get infected, too. Self-care OTC measures are the usual treatment. Yearly 60,000 – 120,000 older adults are hospitalized and 6,000 – 10,000 die from RSV infection.

HOW RISKY?

The virus spreads through individuals' coughing and sneezing and is contagious for three to eight days. The virus can linger on hard surfaces for several hours. Touch your mouth, nose, or eyes after touching a contaminated object and you're infected. Immunosuppressed patients can shed the virus for up to four weeks. Seniors who are at most risk are those who are over 60, asthmatics; have chronic heart and lung disease; are chemo, radiation, or cancer target therapy patients; and/or have organs transplanted. RSV is more dominant now because the senior generation is more numerous than ever before.

SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

The mild symptoms are congested/runny nose; copious discharge from the nose different than from a common cold; dry cough; low-grade fever; sore throat; headache; and sneezing. Severe cases can spread to the lower respiratory tract causing pneumonia or bronchiolitis which can cause wheezing, rapid, and difficult breathing, and cyanosis (blue skin due to lack of oxygen). RSV can aggravate individuals who have asthma, COPD, and congestive heart failure. If you develop any of the severe symptoms seek emergency care.

RSV & COVID 19

Both viruses are respiratory and symptoms can be similar. RSV can lower your immunity and increase the risk of getting COVID. These two infections may occur together which can worsen the severity of COVID illness. Yes, you can have all three at the same time. NOT FUN!

DIAGNOSIS

A physical exam is performed focusing on the respiratory system. Labs and testing are NOT usually required. If there are respiratory complications then blood tests, chest X-rays, pulse oximetry (finger clamp test), and nasal swab samples may be required. Early diagnosis yields the best outcomes.

TREATMENT

Mild cases can be treated with Tylenol, nasal saline drops, and antibiotics only if suspected bacterial pneumonia is present. Severe cases may result in hospitalization for IV fluids and oxygen. Inhalers (bronchodilators) or steroids have not been proven effective in treating RSV.

PREVENTION

I know you have heard this many times but this is still the best way to keep healthy: wash your hands frequently, avoid exposure by covering your mouth and nose when sneezing, keep things clean, avoid close contact, wear a mask (especially in buildings), do not share drinking glasses, and avoid smokers. Please get reliable medical information from medical professionals NOT from friends, acquaintances, strangers, relatives, or Muppets.

PREVENTION #1: VACCINATION

We are in a TRIPLEDEMIC where all three viruses are circulating in high quantities at the same time. All three viruses are very different from each other. So, when you see on TV, or news/social media about getting vaccinated for RSV, please do so ASAP when the vaccines are available. Medicare covers all vaccines. Some insurance may cover them or, if not, go to the public health clinics in your area. The question is whether you should get all three vaccines together. I researched this and the answers were "yes" and "no." Some practitioners said "yes" for all three, others said COVID and Flu are okay together but wait two weeks for the RSV vaccine. Talk to your health practitioner. BE SAFE, not Sorry. 😊

THE SAGE / PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



Alex, the son of the President of the United States, and Britain's Prince Henry have a lot in common: Stunning good looks, undeniable charisma, international popularity... and a total disdain for each other. Separated by an ocean, their long-running feud hasn't really been an issue, until a disastrous--and very public--altercation at a royal event becomes tabloid fodder, driving a potential wedge in U.S./British relations at the worst possible time. Going into damage-control mode, their families and handlers force the two rivals into a staged "truce."
