In the fall of 2016, several SAGE and Prime Timers members put together a proposal to establish a semi-monthly contemporary topics and ideas discussion group. This inquiry eventually

led to the formation of the Prime Gentlemen/ SAGE Roundtable Group, with discussions spanning a wide range of areas including science, politics, education, psychology, and technology. It was decided that each session would have a discussion leader who would provide a brief introduction to the chosen topic as well as be a facilitator to guide the conversation. The idea of inviting outside speakers was eventually suggested. Although the group has been very popular since its beginning, meetings are now suspended until further notice.

Initially, a small core of members provided collective leadership and delivered most of the presentations. Eventually, invited presenters from outside the group were added to the mix. Over time, presentations based on personal experiences were included, which further contributed to the popularity of the group. In the spring of 2020, with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the group could no longer convene in person so it transitioned to online meetings using the Zoom platform. The online format offered the added advantage of enabling participants and presenters from around the world to join. In April 2022, as pandemic restrictions eased, the group introduced Zoom hybrid meetings, allowing members to gather either in person at the Pride Center or join via Zoom. Like other groups, post-pandemic participation has declined, relative to pre-pandemic levels. If The Round Table is to resume and succeed in the future, a commitment to a new "collective leadership" is required. Bye, Bye Dry

We have all had the problem of dry eye at least once in our lives. Dry eyes affect over 30% of adults over 50. The lubrication of our eyes is from our tear film which is made from fatty oils mucus and water. Problems with any of these substances will cause dry eyes or dry eye syndrome (DES).

Risk Factors

- Being over 50.
- Women. Sorry ladies but 61% at the onset of and during menopause are affected. If you take hormonal replacement therapy (38% do) this is closely related to DES.
- Eating a diet that is low in vitamin A. Good food sources which include liver, carrots, broccoli, fish, walnuts, vegetable oils, or food low in omega-3 fatty acids.
- Wearing contact lenses or surgery to correct nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, or presbyopia.

Cause

There are many reasons for tear film dysfunction as hormonal changes, autoimmune disease, inflamed eyelid glands, or allergic eye disease. There are two classifications of dry eye.

- 1. Decreased tear production caused by aging (isn't it always). Medications such as antihistamines, decongestants, hormone replacement therapy, or antidepressants. Medications for high blood pressure, acne, birth control, and Parkinson's disease. Medical conditions such as allergic eye disease, rheumatoid arthritis, auto-immune diseases, thyroid disorders, scleroderma (hardening/contraction of the skin), or vitamin A deficiency.
- 2. Increased tear evaporation is caused by glands that secret oil become clogged usually from skin disorders. Common causes of evaporation are eyelid allergies, preservatives in eye drops, wind, smoke, dry air, and vitamin A deficiency.

Symptoms of DES

The most common symptoms are red, burning, or itchy eyes, excessive tearing (reflex response to dryness), blurry vision, sensitive sore eyes, eyelid inflammation, gritty or sandy feeling, or foreign body sensations.

Complications

Dry eyes can cause eye infections and damage the surface of your eyes. DES can make it difficult to perform everyday activities such as reading.

Diagnosis

A comprehensive eye exam is completed by an eye care specialist. They may conduct a test to measure the volume and quality of your tears.

Treatment

Your healthcare practitioner can recommend an OTC medication. Special prescriptive medication or nasal sprays can increase tear production. Procedures can include:

- closing the tear ducts to reduce tear loss.
- special contact lenses to hold moisture.
- unblocking oil glands.
- punctal plugs which are tiny silicone or gel plugs can be inserted into the tear ducts to block tear drainage, conserving natural tears.
- light therapy or eyelid massage.

Prevention

The following are DES preventions: Keep hydrated, blink regularly, avoid hot air (hair dryers) or cold air as car a/c blowing in your eyes, add moisture to indoor air especially if you are up north in winter, consider wraparound sunglasses or other protective eyewear, take frequent breaks during long tasks as reading especially with computers, beware of your environment as in airplanes or travel to dry or mountainous areas, position your computer screen below eye level, stop smoking and avoid smokers, annual eye exams and keep your eyes well lubricated even when they do not feel dry. Say bye-bye to dry eyes.

THE SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



Two young men make a connection neither of them expects or knows how to navigate. Casey, a young man from the countryside running from a small-town scandal, finds himself down and out in the big smoke of Sydney. When he meets Tib, a young city lad, struggling with his own scars of isolation, there's chemistry, not only sexually but also emotionally as both men find something they have been missing. Can they overcome their own insecurities and let the other in, or are the walls they have built too strong to knock down?

Lonesome demonstrates a mature use of sex in cinema, a treatment that communicates narrative purpose without diminishing sex's animalistic, physical side. Sex isn't just a means of survival for Casey; it's a silent language expressing his desire to be loved. Dark, dirty,

and proudly sexy, there is a breathless sensuality too, hidden beneath the cold composition of rampant sex. A movie that revels in filth, but is at its most uncomfortable when it simply lets its lead characters exist. This is a character study about Casey, a young cowboy whose social performance depends solely on how much he can give.

Louder Than Words, is a short film that follows a young musician named Ansel and his unexpected encounter with Niall, an endearing, deaf dancer. The film explores the sheer struggle that gay people often face in a culture that is yet to fully foster accepting spaces for courtship and love. At its core, the story portrays how difficult it can be to communicate romantic interest as a gay person, and in this case, an added impediment of being hearing impaired.
