SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

The selection for the January meeting is *In a Strange Room*, by South African author **Damon Galgut**. According to an overview



from Publishers Weekly, there's a lot of travel in Galgut's novel, but he's more interested in depicting the randomness, heightened sensitivity, dread, and possibility that come from unfamiliar places than in seeing the sights. A South African man travels in Greece, Lesotho, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Tanzania, and India, forming the complicated, tenuous relationships that provide the book's three sections titles (Follower; Lover; Guardian). This character, who bears the author's name and seems to share his history, is both "he" and "I." Though these shifts can occur in the space of a sentence, they're surprisingly easy to accept, and attentive readers will get a subtle, frank depiction of some of the problems of writing: "he" seems to be Galgut, but often experiences himself as divided, uncertain, and blurry as a fictional character evading his creator; "I" often steps in to remind us of the limits of memory and the artificiality of genre distinctions. At its best Galgut's tale has the feel of arriving at a destination you'd never planned to go. It's not always pleasant, but it's strangely fascinating.

We invite you to join the discussion about this novel, which was shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize in 2010, on **Saturday, January 13**, from **11AM to 12 Noon**. The meeting will be held at the **Stonewall Library**, located at **1300 East Sunrise Blvd., Fort Lauderdale**, and simultaneously online using the Zoom platform.

Go for Ann Ya'll

Happy New Year. This title is not for our beautiful SAGE member Ann Smith but it's my first bad pun (at least I am honest) for 2024. So, we begin our new year as a reminder for your **annual** wellness visit.

The Medicare Annual Wellness Visit created in 2011 as part of the Affordable Care Act, focuses on health promotion and preventive care. This visit is covered **100%** by Medicare Part B and can be used once every 12 months. When you make an appointment with your primary care practitioner tell them you want an <u>Annual</u> <u>Wellness Visit.</u>

Ok, I can hear moans and groans out there in SAGE Land from members:

- I have not seen a doctor in years and I feel fine
- I do not need to see a doctor
- I see a doctor already and I do not need this.

I hate to tell you we are not spring chickens anymore (but still cute) and many medical problems do not have symptoms such as high blood pressure, glaucoma, diabetes lung cancer, and sleep apnea.

A Medicare Annual Wellness visit is **NOT** a physical. The goal of the Wellness visit is to maintain your current health and **prevent** future problems. This visit does **NOT** include a physical examination, diagnosis of an illness, lab, or other testing and treatment for current condi-

What is done on a Wellness visit?

- You will be asked to complete a high-risk assessment questionnaire.
- Recording of height, weight, body mass index (BMI), blood pressure, and other routine measurements.
- Review of your medical and family history.
- Review your current health care providers and any prescriptions (too many or too little?), vitamins, and/or supplements you're taking.
- Creation of a health screening schedule for the next 5-10 years based on your age, family history, and unique risk factors.
- Review of functional ability (your ability to perform everyday tasks on your own) and safety (first visit only).
- Creation of a list of risk factors/conditions along with recommendations/treatment options.
- Discussion of advance care planning (care you would receive if you could not speak for yourself).
- Personalized health advice and referrals for issues such as weight management, falls prevention, diet and nutrition, and smoking cessation
- A cognitive assessment to check for dementia, memory loss, depression, anxiety, and other conditions.
- Evaluate the severity of pain you may be experiencing, and review your existing treatment plan.

To maintain your health, give thought to a Wellness exam and coast along in 2024 with a good goal toward 2025 and beyond.
