
SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

Courting Mr. Lincoln is the page-turning and surprising story of a young Abraham Lincoln and the two people who loved



him best: a sparky, marriageable Mary Todd and Lincoln's best friend, Joshua Speed.



About to turn 21 when she arrives in Springfield in 1839, Mary, who teeters on the brink of old-maidenhood becomes intrigued by Lincoln, a rising politician who finds a woman with brains and savvy enticing rather than off-putting. She doesn't yet realize how destabilizing their budding romance is for Lincoln

and Speed. By the time Mary appears, Lincoln and Speed, each profoundly lonely for his own reasons, share an unusually intense bond apparent to all.

Told in the alternating voices of Mary Todd and Joshua Speed, and rich with historical detail, *Courting Mr. Lincoln* creates a sympathetic and complex portrait of Mary unlike any that has come before; a moving portrayal of the deep and very real connection between the two men; and most of all, an evocation of the unformed man who would grow into one of the nation's most beloved presidents.

Wax On, Wax Off

(Mr. Miyagi, "The Karate Kid.")

Ear wax is also known as cerumen and about 34% of seniors have this problem. Cerumen is a waxy oil that is secreted by tiny sebaceous and sweat glands that are around your outer ear canal. A small amount of earwax migrates from deep in your ear canal like a conveyor belt. It carries wax, dead skin cells, tiny hairs, and other microscopic debris to the outside. Your jaw movements and chewing help this migration. Ear wax also is a protective lubricant repelling water and preventing the skin from drying out. It is also acidic to protect you from bacteria and fungi. Earwax is less acidic in Diabetics because they become more vulnerable to ear infections.

Impaction (Blockage)

Blockage may occur from the following causes:

Using hearing aids, earplugs, and earbuds; an abundance of ear hair; skin conditions such as eczema; putting cotton swabs or any items into the ear; over age 55; mis-shapen ear canal which hinders natural wax removal, and developmental disabilities.

Symptoms of Impaction

Go to your Primary Healthcare Provider (PHP) if you develop one or more of the following symptoms that increase in severity: earache, fullness feeling in the ear, ringing or noises in the ear (tinnitus), hearing loss, dizziness, cough, itchiness, odor, pain or discharge from the ear.

Simple at-home treatment for non-severe symptoms

- NEVER, NEVER use a cotton swab (Q-Tip) for extracting earwax. You will cause further impaction and more costly problems.
- Soften earwax with a few drops of baby oil, mineral oil glycerin, hydrogen peroxide, or over-the-counter products such as Debrox or Murine.
- After a few days of oil treatment, you can easily use a bulb-type syringe to flush with warm water. The water should be at body temperature to prevent dizziness.

When to see a PHP

If you do not have relief from the drops after a few days and develop ear odor or drainage, fever, and/or persistent earache.

Treatment

Your PHP may use a micro-suction to remove the ear wax or an aural toilet. No, she/he is NOT going to stick your head in a toilet. This toilet is an instrument with a small hoop at one end that is used to clean the ear and scrape out the wax. If an infection develops the PHP will likely prescribe antibiotic ear drops.

Prevention

DO

- Use a damp washcloth to wipe the outer portion of your ears each day.
- If you are prone to above-average earwax buildup, occasionally use the ear drops.

DON'T

- Don't insert cotton swabs or any other objects (including fingers) in your ears.
- Beware of internet or social media ads for super easy earwax removal. They are worthless scams.
- Candles are NOT a natural method to remove earwax and are not effective. They may cause burns or perforate your ear drum.
- You do not want to remove all the ear wax because it is a protective substance.


Prevention is always the best cure and happy clear hearing.



THE SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE

Marc is an artist living in London whose husband, Oliver, dies in a car accident. Marc tries to navigate the first yar of life as a stunned widower with the help of his close friends. They're all creative people and all in their late 30s. **Good Grief** focuses on the emotional dimensions of loss. When you've entwined your life with someone else's, what happens when they're gone? When love evaporates without warning, how can you keep living?

Nobody can tell you how to fix it, because it can't be fixed, only lived through. The pain that accompanies loss sticks around like a hollow spot in your chest, changing shape but never disappearing. In **Good Grief**, resolution of grief is not the point. The idea is to keep on loving, to find new life.





Louder Than Words, is a short film that follows a young musician named Ansel and his unexpected encounter with Niall, an endearing, deaf dance. The film explores the sheer struggle that gay people

often face in a culture that is yet to fully foster accepting spaces for courtship and love. At its core, the story portrays how difficult it can be to communicate romantic interest as a gay person, and in this case, an added impediment of bearing hearing impaired.
