SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

Every marginalized group struggling to find its way toward equality will inevitably wrestle with the question of who gets



to tell its stories, and what voices and perspectives within the group should be elevated and spotlighted to accurately reflect the truth of its existence. In **Bad**



Gays: A Homosexual History, authors Huw Lemmey and Ben Miller sidestep that question to ask an even more pointed one: What stories should we be telling about ourselves? They suggest an answer about "the gay people in history who do not flatter us, and whom we cannot make into heroes: the liars, the powerful, the criminal, and the successful."

The title "Bad Gays" is a bit of a misnomer, however. These are the stories of gay and queer people who did terrible things and held terrible views, but the bulk of these histories are less about "evil" gays and more about gays who reacted to the world around them, sometimes in shocking ways, sometimes in destructive ways, but guite often in the only ways that made sense to them, given the times. This approach is especially helpful in framing the lives and choices of people like Frederick the Great and notorious Italian Renaissance satirist and blackmailer Pietro Aretino, well before the idea of gayness as an identity existed. The authors express an acute understanding that people have always lived in a stew of history, and they situate each of their subjects not just within the ideas and attitudes of their day, but also within the legal and religious constraints that defined them as outcasts and abominations. Still, the authors never forget that they're talking about conquerors and colonialists, racists and anti-Semites, criminals and conspirators, from Hadrian to Ronnie Kray to Roy Cohn.

HRH BPH

Recently His Royal Highness King Charles III was treated for BPH. BPH is Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (enlargement). This is a noncancerous enlargement of the prostate gland. The prostate (NOT prostrate, often called mistakenly) is a walnut-sized tissue located below the bladder surrounding it and in front of the rectum. The prostate is a gland that produces semen (the pool for the sperm to swim in). When the prostate gets bigger it squeezes the urethra (the tube from the bladder through the penis) and obstructs the flow of urine. This problem occurs in about 50% of men over 60 and 90% of men over age 85. Risk factors are for men who are black or have a family history of prostate cancer. Diabetes, heart disease, and obesity are contributing causes. BPH and cancer of the prostate have similar symptoms.

Symptoms

The squeezing of the prostate will cause a frequent or urgent need to pee, peeing often at night, trouble starting to pee, inconsistent stream (starts and stops), and an inability to empty the bladder. Serious symptoms are urinary tract infections, or unable to pee or blood in the urine.

Diagnosis

The best procedure to determine if your prostate is enlarged is by a digital rectal exam. Many men fear this procedure either physically or mentally. It is not painful, a slight discomfort but not painful. Your practitioner inserts a gloved finger (not the entire hand) into the rectum to feel the surface of the prostate for size and any hard areas. A thorough health history is taken. Other tests may be ordered: a urine flow test and a test to determine how much urine remains after you empty your bladder. A cystoscopy (look into your bladder with a thin tube through your penis) may be required. A prostate-specific antigen (PSA) blood test may be ordered. If it is elevated it may be either BPH or prostate cancer. The PSA blood test results cannot differentiate between BPH and prostate cancer: hence the need for digital rectal exam.

Treatment

There is no cure for BPH. Here is the progression of treatment.

- A. If the symptoms are mild the treatment plan is called "Watchful Waiting" whereby your practitioner monitors if your symptoms change in severity.
- B. Medications. Medications can relax the prostate which reduces tension on the urethra or decrease a hormone which can slow the growth of the prostate.
- C. Surgery. There are many different surgical procedures for BPH and new ones are being developed. Some of the procedures use laser beams which are less invasive than prostate cutting. John Hopkins, Mayo Clinic, and Cleveland Clinic recommend this new procedure called the Holmium Laser Enucleation of the Prostate (HoLEP). I have attached more information under the References and Resources. Thank you to Tom N. of Wisconsin for bringing this to my attention.

Talk to your urologist and work with him for the most effective and least invasive procedure for you.

Prevention

The best prevention is to make lifestyle changes to improve your prostate's health. Yes, that word is coming up again exercise. The Mediterranean diet of fruits vegetables and healthy fats will benefit you. Avoid or limit your intake of alcohol, caffeine, dairy, red meat, and sodium. Be good to your body and your body will be good to you.

See your practitioner as soon as possible if you have any of the symptoms. Since BPH and especially Prostate Cancer have similar symptoms the earlier the diagnosis the better outcome. Although there is no cure for BPH at least they can treat your symptoms and live with a normal pee period and a sleepful night.




THE SAGE / PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



A gay homeless drug addict, Jeremy Pope, has made up his mind to change his life for the better and join the Marines during the years when the US military pursued a "don't ask, don't tell" policy towards homosexual recruits. For him, enlistment was a desperation move. He makes a stop at home to tell his mother he's enlisting, but she has virtually disowned him because of his homosexuality. Once indoctrinated into basic training he comes into conflict with the hard ass drill sergeant. During a shower session, Pope's fellow comrades catch him with an erection which results in his buds giving him a vicious beatdown. He accepts all this with a kind of stoic misery. And surprisingly, he does keep up with the training.

THE INSPECTION is a wonderfully nuanced depiction of a queer man's rite of passage in the most redundantly male of institutions. Pope's performance earned a Golden Globe nomination for best actor.

STRANGERS is a poetic film about human connection. In an unexpected encounter under a tree, two strangers argue about who should stay there, but their reasons are both too deep to ignore. This is an intriguing story about two broken characters who accidentally meet at a crossroads where they awkwardly touch on the possibility of love. This short film is the winner of 35 awards.
