Those of you who would like to sit together at one of our events, please arrive early and at the same time, or wait for one another before checking in, so your party will be able to sit at the same table, if available.



SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

In his auspicious debut, *The New Life: A Novel*, British author **Tom Crewe** excavates the oppression and criminal punishment of gay men in 1890s England.

Set in London, the story depicts a collaboration between wealthy author John Addington, 49, and physician/essayist Henry Ellis, 30, on a book about the taboo subject

of homosexuality. John and his wife are sexually estranged, and he brings his lover, Frank, 28, to live in his family house. Henry has an unconsummated marriage with Edith, who lives separately with her female lover. John's and Henry's completed study, Sexual Inversion, is full of anonymous case studies and testimonials, and it amounts to an argument for sexual freedom for gay men. Their decision to publish, especially so close to Oscar Wilde's highly publicized conviction for a samesex affair, has far-reaching ramifications for John. The work, though, goes largely unnoticed until a London bookseller, who is being spied on for having radical beliefs, is arrested for selling the book, which, according to the charges, is "lewd, wicked, bawdy, scandalous, and obscene libel." As the bookseller's trial approaches, John's family life implodes; he becomes reckless, and his behavior panics Henry, who makes a decision that influences the trial.

Crewe uses meticulously researched period details to great effect and rounds out the narrative with solid characters and tight pacing. Readers will look forward to seeing what this talented author does next.

"Let's hear it for the boys!"



The "boys" that I am referring to are your buddies that are down south. As we age, they keep getting lower, and lower, and lower. They also are not as productive as when we were young. Low testosterone (hypogonadism) is increasing among senior men. Testosterone is a hormone (No, I will NOT tell that old hormone joke on how it's made) produced in the testes.

This hormone maintains the following body necessities: bone density, fat distribution, muscle strength and mass, facial and body hair, red blood cell production, sex drive (libido), and sperm production. Testosterone declines 1% after age 30. A diagnosis of hypogonadism has to be differentiated from the disease versus normal aging. Those who are at risk for low testosterone are the following: seniors, the obese, poorly managed Type 2 diabetes, chronic medical conditions such as kidney dysfunction or cirrhosis of the liver, and those with HIV/AIDS.

Symptoms

Symptoms may include the following: reduced sex drive, erectile dysfunction, shrinking testicles, loss of armpit and pubic hair, hot flashes (yes, male menopause), night sweats, low to zero sperm count, depressed mood, difficulty with concentration and memory, increased body fat, enlarged male breasts, decrease muscle strength and decrease endurance. So, you can see we all may have many of these symptoms but is it normal aging or the disease of hypogonadism?

Diagnosis

The following blood tests are performed:

Total testosterone level blood test. This test is done twice (about 1-2 weeks apart) to confirm a low level. The blood draw must be done between 8 AM & 10 AM when one's level is at its highest. The other tests are to see if there is a problem with one's pituitary glands causing low levels.

Treatment

Testosterone Replacement Therapy (TRT) has had a dramatic growth, in 1980 the amount prescribed was \$18 million and now it is almost 2 billion dollars There are many different routes for TRT. There are gels applied every day. Intramuscular injections are given every 1-2 weeks or every 10 weeks. Testosterone patches are applied every day. Testosterone pellets are implanted under the skin by a specialist every three to six months. Sticky tablets are applied to your gums twice a day. A nasal gel was applied three times a day. A pill used only for those with other specific medical conditions. As with all medications, there are side effects and many risks with TRT. TRT costs range from \$1650 to \$3200 per year without insurance but 93% of Medicare prescription drug plans cover this drug.

Prevention

Lifestyle changes can keep testosterone at normal levels as eating a healthy diet, exercising (that word again), weight management, adequate sleep, stress management, and avoiding excessive alcohol and drug usage.

If you are having any of the symptoms check with a urologist. We can keep your "boys" safe and productive.




