

SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

This month's selection for discussion is ***Our Evenings* by Alan Hollinghurst**.

Dave Win is thirteen years old when he first goes to stay with the Hadlows, the sponsors of his scholarship at a local boarding school where their son, Giles, is his contemporary. For Dave, this weekend, with its games and challenges and surprising encounters, will open up heady new possibilities, even as it exposes him to Giles's envy and violence. As *Our Evenings* unfolds over half a century, the two boys' careers diverge dramatically: Dave, a gifted actor struggling with convention and discrimination; Giles, an increasingly powerful and dangerous politician.

Our Evenings is Dave Win's own account of his life as a schoolboy and student, his first love affairs in London, and on the road with an experimental theatre company, and of a late-life affair that transforms his sixties with a new sense of happiness and a perilous security; but it is also, very movingly, the story of his hard-working widowed mother, whose own life takes an unexpected new turn after her son leaves home.

Both dark and luminous, poignant and wickedly funny, Alan Hollinghurst's new novel gives us a portrait of modern England through the lens of one man's acutely observed and often unnerving experience. It is a story of race and class, theatre and sexuality, love and the cruel shock of violence, from the finest writer of our age.

A Promising Future for Heart Health

Focusing on **early identification** in babies of genetic links to the development of high blood pressure by age 30, you could modify that child's diet to prevent high blood pressure. **Prevention** as early in life as possible could make an enormous difference in reducing cardiovascular disease, which remains the most common cause of death in adults worldwide. Instead of waiting, measures are available to identify and prevent the development of high blood pressure, high cholesterol, or diabetes in the first place. Genetic tests for profiling heart disease risk scores are available now and affect heart health at every stage of life—from birth to old age. It is never too early or too late to start. Discuss with your healthcare provider, regardless of the stage of life you are in, your risk for developing heart disease, genetic and other testing, prevention measures you should be taking, and treatment for those who already have heart disease. For people who already have heart disease, medications that lower blood pressure and cholesterol are an important part of avoiding future heart problems.

The **Broward Heart Project** (HeartProject@Broward.org) evaluated seven thousand people who had no symptoms. Of that number, four thousand needed help ranging from medication to stents to open heart surgery. A CT scan of the heart was performed on people between the ages of 45 and 70 who had one qualifying condition: high blood pressure or high cholesterol or diabetes or history of smoking, or family history of heart disease. The test is a lifesaver and free to Broward County residents. The program was resumed on December 10, 2025, is spearheaded by the Cleveland Clinic, and funded in part by the Florida Panthers Foundation.

Targeting Inflammation – the artery-damaging process that leads to a heart attack--in June of 2023, the FDA approved the anti-inflammatory drug colchicine—commonly used to treat gout— for people who have or are at elevated risk for heart disease. Colchicine lowers the risk of heart attack and related problems by 30%. There will soon be a whole new battery of anti-inflammatory drugs.

Cardiac cell therapy is directed toward repairing damaged heart muscle. Research continues on injecting stem cells to regenerate heart muscle and encourage blood vessel growth.

Many hundreds of people die each year waiting for a heart transplant. **Transplanting pig hearts**—humans and pigs have comparable size—shows promise for people with end-stage heart failure. People with advanced heart failure, while waiting for a heart transplant may receive an **improved left ventricular assist device (LVAD)**.

THE SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



PLAINCLOTHES is a 2025 romantic thriller. Set in 1990s New York, a working-class undercover police officer is tasked with entrapping and apprehending homosexual males cruising for sex, only to find himself drawn to one of his targets. He defies professional orders when he falls in love. This tension-filled coming out story, *Plainclothes*, showcases the perils of love and the effects of isolation. *Plainclothes* is a heart-felt love story that

deals with internal conflict, family, and the complexities of sexual identity in the face of societal and personal expectations.

The story has echoes of human rights group *OutRage* protesting against the Metropolitan Police over their entrapment of gay men in the 1990s—a world before dating apps and legislation protecting gay rights. Last year, the Metropolitan Police finally admitted to “failings of the past”. The protagonist of the film, Lucas’s professional betrayal of other gay men, reminds the viewer of the deep self-loathing gay men were still made to feel during the Clinton administration. This was the era of the “Defense of Marriage Act” and “Don’t Ask. Don’t Tell.” policy that demanded LGBTQ+ people in the military keep their identities secret. *Plainclothes* saves its best scene for last when a family dinner whirls off in an unexpected direction following the discovery of a letter. The fallout powerfully shows the consequences of such institutional repression.
