10 years ago, on June 24, 2016, President Barack Obama issued a proclamation noting that the Stonewall “raid and uprising” was the “catalyst that launched the modern LGBT civil rights movement” and established the Stonewall National Monument at Christopher Park in Greenwich Village. Last year, the current administration mandated that “gender ideology” – references to transgender and queer people – be removed from the National Park Service website page for the monument. This year, the National Trust for Historic Preservation named the monument one of America’s most endangered historic places, citing federal actions aimed at censoring and rewriting the history of the site. At that location, Marsha P. Johnson, Sylvia Rivers, and other trans and gender non-conforming individuals were central to creating the resistance, which is the foundation of the modern LGBTQ+ civil rights movement. Their contribution to our history cannot be deleted. This February, the administration ordered the National Park Service to remove the rainbow flag flying at the site. After vociferous objections and the filing of a lawsuit, the flag returned.

June was officially declared as Pride Month by President Clinton in 1999. President Obama issued annual proclamations designating June as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Pride Month. President Biden proclaimed June as Pride Month during the years of his administration. Last year, President Trump announced June is no longer Pride Month.

Despite the pronouncements and machinations of the *ancient regime*, June will forever be Pride Month. We will not be erased like a rainbow crosswalk in Florida. Take comfort in the results of the latest Gallup Poll which revealed that 23% of those under thirty years of age identify as LGBTQ+. Be Out and Proud this month and every month. Celebrate!



## NOTICE ABOUT THE MAILED NEWSLETTER

One of the most popular benefits of SAGE membership is receiving our monthly newsletter, The SAGE. When first published, a hardcopy version was mailed to each member. Today, 80% of members opt to receive only online copies, which are emailed monthly. These members are able to avoid the \$10.00 increase in their annual renewal fee, which is intended to cover the cost of the mailed newsletter.

However, due to an increase in the size of the newsletter and a rise in costs in general, the actual cost to print and mail the newsletter currently exceeds \$50.00 each year. This amount is considerably greater than the \$10.00 annual fee charged to those members who receive mailed copies. Lifetime members who receive mailed copies currently pay no additional fees.

The SAGE Board of Directors believes that this spending imbalance is not sustainable. The Board has decided to increase the fee for those members who want to receive the mailed newsletter. Additional information will be provided in the July issue of The Sage.

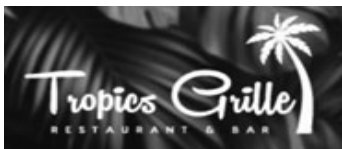

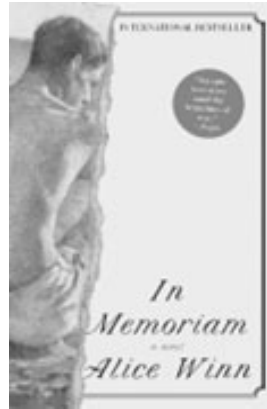

This month's selection for discussion is **In Memoriam** by **Alice Winn**.



It's 1914, and World War I is ceaselessly churning through thousands of young men on both sides of the fight. To Gaunt's horror, Ellwood rushes to join him at the front, and the rest of their classmates soon follow. Now death surrounds them in all its grim reality, often inches away, and no one knows who will be next.

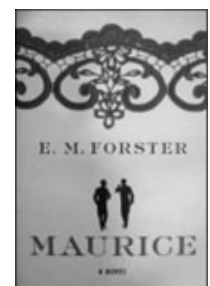
An epic tale of both the devastating tragedies of war and the forbidden romance that blooms in its grip, *In Memoriam* is a breathtaking debut.

LGBTI individuals of any age, who are sexually active or inactive, are wise to see a dedicated physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant who specializes in sexual health care and infectious disease management, as their primary health care provider. Such knowledge and sensitivity to the physical, emotional, financial, and confidentiality needs of the LGBTI community provide best practices for person-centered care. Compassionate, expert primary care and pharmacy services can help individuals achieve their healthcare goals with innovative treatment options. Further, they often provide blood testing, lab results, injections, vaccines, Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PREP), nutritional consulting, mental health counseling, infectious disease care, education, transportation assistance, real time telehealth appointments, participation in the latest research studies, and case management. Such practices accept most Medicare, Medicaid, commercial, and private insurance. They also maintain various grant and uninsured programs. CAN Community Health Providers are committed to creating an inclusive environment that treats all individuals with respect and dignity, breaking down barriers, and fostering a community united against stigma. The Silver Connection is a SAGE of South Florida and CAN initiative designed for adults 55+ that promotes sexual health, HIV awareness, and healthy intimacy through positive education, community connections, and prevention resources.

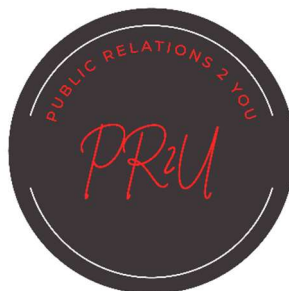

# THE SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE

## MICHAEL



There was – and is – no one like Michael Jackson.

Nearly 17 years after his death at age 50 in 2009, the pop superstar’s music and art continue to electrify, even as his unprecedented fame, shrouded in rumor and unsettling allegations, confounds and mystifies. He’s been exalted and excoriated, deified and dragged

through the mud, and yet he remains elusive, a contradiction whose truth, whatever it may be, will likely never be known. There’s little doubt that this is slick, celebratory biopic chronicling the rise of pop superstar Michael Jackson, from his musical beginnings in the 1960s to the heights of his 1980s fame.

The movie certainly wastes no time playing the hits. It picks up in 1966 with eight-year-old Michael and his brothers literally whipped into musical shape by taskmaster patriarch Joseph, all while saintly mother Katherine looks on. Christened the Jackson 5, the boys dance for pennies on the Chitlin’ Circuit, find Motown stardom with their miraculous early hits, and – faster than one of his signature spins – the emergent solo Michael is recording his breakthrough record “Off the Wall” with Quincy Jones and plotting world domination with “Thriller.” Doing an uncanny impersonation of his uncle, Jaafar Jackson- who shares Michael’s signature moves and his contagious smile – give a warm, sometime soulful performance. Whenever he’s performing – which is often – the movie finds its transformative charge by keeping the focus on the music, which remains among the wonders of the pop world.

Only occasionally does the movie evoke a sense of Jackson’s immense loneliness, an isolation that led him to create the fantasy world that would be his undoing. Intended as a victory lap for the emancipated solo star, the recreation of Jackson’s 1989 “Bad” performance bristles with defiance and rising aggression. Michael leaves us with an readable image of its subject – his eyes hidden behind an outstretched hand, his mouth locked in a hardened grimace, as though readying himself for a turbulent future to come. Perhaps it’s just as Jackson himself would have wanted – to remain a mystery.
