HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY!



250 years ago, on July 4th, 1776, at the Pennsylvania State House in Philadelphia, the Second Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence which proclaimed that we “all are created equal...with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.” At that same location on July 4, 1965, 40 activists staged a peaceful demonstration for recognition and support of “homosexual civil rights.” These “annual reminder” demonstrations continued through 1969. After the “Stonewall Uprising”, a more visible and vocal activism for LGBTQ+ rights spread nationwide. Yes, over the past sixty years, our

community has achieved some level of recognition and respect. But our fight for equality and our unalienable rights, in this current political zeitgeist, continues.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEWSLETTER

One of the most popular benefits of SAGE membership is receiving our monthly newsletter, *The SAGE*. When the newsletter was first published, a hardcopy version was mailed to each member. The cost of mailed newsletters was considered to be included in the annual membership fee. Currently, 80% of members have chosen to receive only online copies, which are emailed monthly. Several years ago, the SAGE Board was forced to increase the annual renewal fee by \$1.00 per year for members receiving the mailed newsletters, which was intended to cover the increasing costs of the mailed newsletter. However, due to an increase in the size of the newsletter and a recent rise in costs in general, the actual cost to print and mail the newsletter currently exceeds \$50.00, which is well beyond the \$10.00 annual fee charged to those members who prefer to receive mailed copies. Lifetime members who receive mailed copies currently pay no additional fees. The SAGE Board of Directors has decided that this spending imbalance is not sustainable and that an increase in the fee for those members who want to receive the mailed newsletters is warranted.

Effective July 1, 2026, the annual renewal fee for individual members who want to continue to receive a mailed newsletter will increase from \$45.00 to \$75.00 per year. The renewal fee for couples who want to continue to receive a single mailed newsletter will increase from \$70.00 to \$100.00 per year. This increase will become effective at the time of the next membership renewal date.

For individual members who choose to receive only the emailed copy of the newsletter, the annual renewal fee will remain at the standard \$35.00 per year. For couples who do so, the annual renewal fee will remain at the standard \$60.00 per year.

For new and existing lifetime members who choose to receive a mailed newsletter, an annual fee of \$40.00 will be charged, effective July 1, 2026.

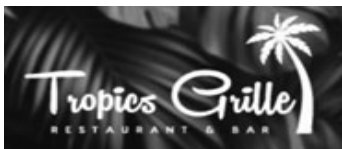

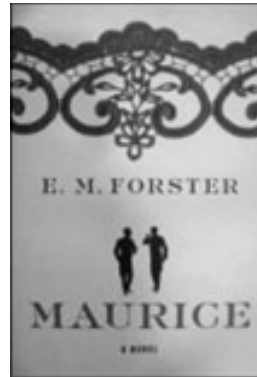
SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

This month's selection for discussion is ***Maurice: A Novel*** by **E. M. Forster**.

E.M. Forster's reputation as one of the finest writers of the twentieth century is based on an output that is both modest in size and remote in time. His last novel, *A Passage to India*, was published in 1924. The appearance of a complete but hitherto unpublished novel is, therefore, a literary event of the greatest importance.



Maurice describes the long and difficult process by which a typical product of middle-class suburbia and education realizes that he is a homosexual. It culminates in an ecstatic love affair through which Maurice both fulfills his nature and, in the compelling series of episodes in which the book closes, rejects his entire inherited system of values and conduct. In this combination –of fulfillment and its inevitable concomitant, rejection– lie the author's reasons and inspiration for writing the novel. Forster wished at once to demonstrate the possibility of love outside normal experience and to expose the rigid structure and morality of a society that did not merely condemn such experience as immoral but, in a more insidious way, regarded it as unnatural.

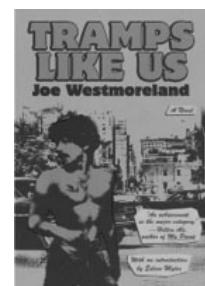
Although its homosexual content was the reason why Forster decided that the novel, completed in 1914, should remain unpublished until his death, *Maurice* cannot be defined by its purpose nor by its theme. It was written by a great novelist at the height of his powers – as those who read it surely find evident.

“FRIENDS WITH BENEFITS’ FOR OLDER ADULTS”

An intimate relationship with no strings attached can be a great fit for the 50+ crowd. It can be perfect for older adults not looking to change their whole life for someone, or to settle down, but seeking healthy connections on mutually agreed-upon terms. **Choose your friends with benefits wisely.** An established friendship where you have built trust can blossom to include sex. You can feel like you are having your physical needs met without establishing a new relationship. Discuss what each of you wants. Make sure the arrangement is fully understood and endorsed by both parties, such as a closed or open relationship. Keep checking in with each other periodically to be sure it is still working for both of you.

Sexually transmitted infections (STI) for adults sixty-five or older have more than doubled in the US in the last decade, a result of multiple factors, including heightened sexual activity in senior-living facilities, low condom use, and lack of knowledge about STIs.

If you are sexually active, **regular testing for STIs is one of the most important things to protect your health.** STIs such as chlamydia, cervical cancer, hepatitis A, B, or C, gonorrhea, human papillomavirus (HPV), fungal infections of the skin or mucous membranes, HIV, herpes, monkeypox, and trichomoniasis often have no or minimal symptoms initially, so you may not know you have one. Infections can cause serious health problems and spread to others. It is important to know if you have an STI, so you and your partners can receive testing and treatment. A healthcare provider can help you decide which tests you need. You may need to provide blood, urine, or swabs from your vagina, throat, or rectum. You can self-test for some infections. Positive results should be followed by seeing a healthcare provider who provides care for people with sexually transmitted infections for an open and honest discussion about your sexual history and to advise you about further testing and treatment. If you are not comfortable talking to your regular healthcare provider about STIs, there are many clinics that provide confidential and free or low-cost testing, such as those found through the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) based on your zip code at: <https://gettested.cdc.gov> or through CAN Community Health locations in South Florida at: www.cancommunityhealth.org.

Primary Prevention Methods or STI Harm Reduction refers to strategies aimed at minimizing the risk of transmission of STIs, including: education about types of STIs, modes of transmission, and regular testing to help with early detection and treatment; barrier methods using dental dams and external or internal condoms to decrease the risk of transmission; topical microbicides effective for preventing HIV infection; open communication about sexual history, testing status, boundaries, comfort levels, respect, safer sex practices, and trust with sex partners; advocating for **pre-exposure vaccinations** that can prevent STIs like Hepatitis A and B or the HPV vaccine to reduce the risk of HPV-related cancers and genital or anal warts, and monkeypox; **pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) medications for HIV prevention**, which have demonstrated safety and efficiency in reducing the risk of HIV; **Doxy Post-exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) for HIV and STIs** taken after unprotected anal sex, which has demonstrated reduction in HIV and some STIs; **HIV treatment as prevention: antiretroviral treatment (ART)** has demonstrated a 96% reduction in transmission to an uninfected partner.

If you are sexually active, get tested regularly, get educated about STIs by a knowledgeable healthcare provider, discuss prevention and treatment options, and enjoy sex with peace of mind.

SAGE/PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



The entrances of drag queen Lola in *Kinky Boots* are a thing to behold – rising from a trapdoor draped in a floor-length crimson gown and wearing a curly blond wig, part Diana Ross, part Whitney Houston. The musical is based on the 2005 film inspired by the real-life story of a troubled Northampton shoe factory that switches to making thigh-high boots for drag queens. It’s a riot of feathers and sparkles, with the production going all out on the costumes.

The foil to Lola’s otherworldly glamour is the everyman character Charlie Price. Charlie is likable, directionless, pulled back home from London by the death of his father to reluctantly take over the ailing family business. A chance encounter with Lola and her friends leads to a mad scheme to save the factory, and a bit of culture clash comedy. *Kinky Boots* approaches gender and sexuality in a warm, good-humored way, and lightly explores themes of fathers and sons, expectations and acceptance.

Harvey Fierstein’s book offers a fair amount of “tell don’t show” along the way. “We may have been born in a small factory town but I sure as hell don’t intend to stay!” Charlie’s fiancé explains. **Cyndi Lauper’s** lyrics have pop music predictability, although you couldn’t call her paean to stilettos obvious (*Sex Is in the Heel*). The poppy/rock energy drives the show. And there is some Latin flair in the upfront and versatile choreography. *Kinky Boots: The Musical* is an extremely enjoyable night out, and a brilliantly unlikely story.
